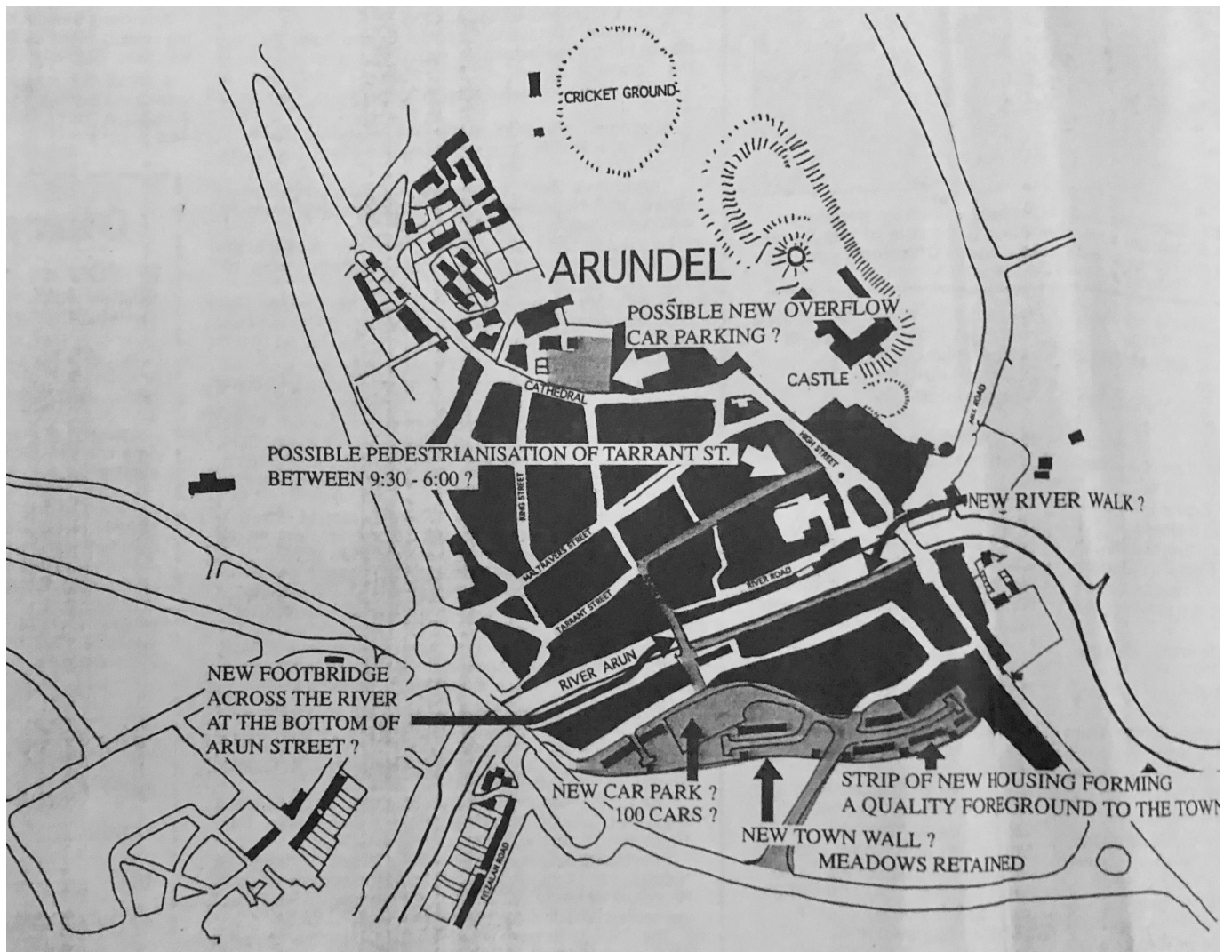


Neil Holland draft Vision for Arundel – dated December 1994



Neil Holland, local architect and longstanding resident prepared a bold plan for Arundel to reduce some of the parking and traffic problems. It was presented as a 'brainstorm' or 'Aunt Sally' to open debate on the future of the Town.

Key points:

- A new access road from the relief road to a new car park south of Fitzalan Road, linked to a new footbridge over the river Arun to the bottom of Arun Street.
- Raised river walk to make the southern footpath useable in all conditions.
- A new area of quality housing featuring a Tudor style roofscape encompassed within a buttressed wall – emphasising the fortified history of the Town which grew around the Norman Castle. NB to be added to existing conservation area.
- The new housing and wall would act as a screen against some of the 'less attractive' developments' and form a natural boundary to the Town skirted by green pasture.
- Remove cars from town centre & emphasise key heritage architecture & assets
- Pedestrian priority/zones on Tarrant Street
